

General Information and Rules

Fees	Grounds fee: \$25.00 / rider Class fees: \$20.00 / class Late fee: \$30.00 / entry after closing Non-showing horses are subject to grounds fee.
Judges	June 17 Kristin Hermann August 5 Lynn Snyder September 9 Robin Birk - L Graduate with Distinction Ride times will be posted on the Creekside website and Facebook page at or before noon on the Friday before each show.
Entries	Entries accepted in the order received. Late entries accepted if time permits.
Closing	Entries, including payment and proof of negative Coggins, must be received the Tuesday before the show (Jun 13, Aug 1, or Sept 5 respectively) or will be considered late.
Classes	Current USEF Western Dressage Intro – Level 3, USEA Beginner Novice - Advanced, USDF Introductory, and USEF Training - Fourth Level Tests offered. Duplicate tests ridden in Test of Choice. Intro Tests, Beginner Novice - Preliminary Test B, and Western Dressage Intro - Basic will be ridden in small arena. All others ridden in standard arena. Classes may be divided into Junior / Young Rider (Jr/YR), Adult Amateur (AA), and Open if entries warrant. Age must be determined by Jan 1, 2017. Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes, or to modify the definitions of divisions and classes in any way.
Awards	Classes place 1 st thru 6 th . Champion and Reserve for each test level with 3 or more riders, calculated by averaging highest 2 test scores per horse and rider combination. All competitors will automatically be signed up for year end awards.
Banquet	Year end awards for both Hunter Jumper and Dressage Schooling Shows will be presented Fri Nov 3 rd during the annual Creekside Awards Banquet at Chestnut Ridge Golf Resort and Conference Center.

Concessions	Breakfast and lunch concessions will be available.
Lodging	Friday evening campers are gladly accepted in designated parking areas. The Blairsville Inn (724-459-7100) and Hampton Inn (724-459-5920) are located less than 10 minutes west of the show grounds.
Schooling	Contestant numbers must be worn during schooling. Schooling is permitted in all arenas from 3 PM until dark on the Friday before the show. Longeing in the indoor arena only. Schooling is permitted on Saturday in schooling ring and indoor arena, with in hand familiarization allowed along the perimeter of the competition arena until 45 minutes before start.
Stabling	A limited number of stalls are available on a first come, first serve basis. Stalls must be reserved by receipt of nonrefundable stall fee, and priority will be given to those reserving an overnight stall. First bedding provided. Stall for show day.....\$30.00 Stall for night before and show day.....\$45.00
Refunds	Refunds, less a \$10 office fee, will be granted before the closing date. All stall reservations and fees are nonrefundable, as are entries after the closing date. Any unsportsmanlike conduct, unsafe riding, or mistreatment of horse or pony, may result in expulsion from the show grounds, without refund of entry fees.
Rules	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Negative Coggins required, and must be within 1 year. Coggins must be included with entries.2. All horses must have yearly shots.3. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.4. All riders must wear an approved protective helmet with harness secured while mounted.5. All riders must compete with schooling show appropriate dress and tack specifications.
